INSTALL

TOOLS REQUIRED FOR THIS STEP: + CHISEL
+ DIE GRINDER OR METAL FILE

STEP | 01 LAYOUT AND INSTALL PREP

1.1 Remove Mounting Hole Caps: Use a heat gun on a low temperature setting to loosen up the adhesive that holds the mounting hole caps to the top of the van. There should be six total. Use a chisel or plastic pry tool to gently remove them from the mounting surface (FIG 1).

1.2 Clean Mounting Surface: Clean the area using goo-gone and denatured alcohol to thoroughly remove any adhesive residue (FIG 2).

1.3 Ensure Bolt Clearance: Dry fit the landing pads onto the mounting surface and ensure that bolts can pass through to the factory threaded slots (FIG 3). If there are clearance issues, use a die grinder to carefully enlarge the holes for access to threaded mounting holes (FIG 4).

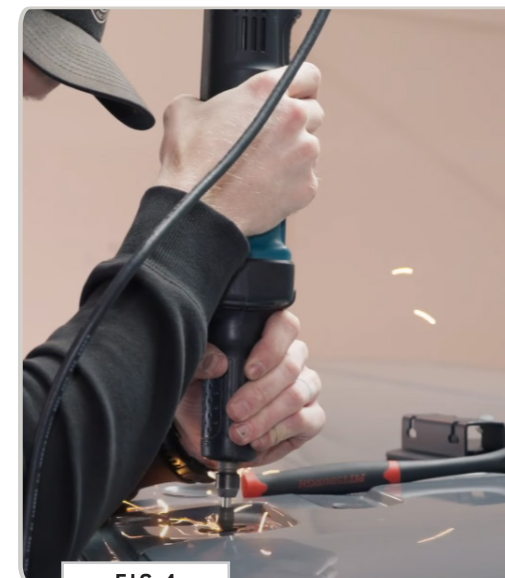

TOOLS REQUIRED FOR THIS STEP: + 13MM BOX WRENCH OR SOCKET
+ CAULKING GUN

STEP | 02 LANDING PAD INSTALL

2.1 Install Landing Pads: Secure the landing pads to the roof by tightening down **M8 Bolts with loctite and 5/16" Bonded Sealing Washers (FIG 5+6)**.

2.2 Apply Sealant: Apply a small bead of exterior waterproof sealant around the outside of each landing pad (**FIG 7**).

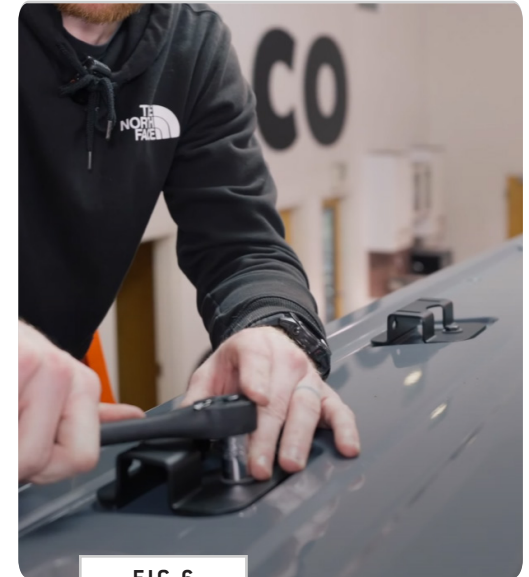

TOOLS REQUIRED FOR THIS STEP:

- + 7/16" WRENCH OR SOCKET
- + 3/16" ALLEN WRENCH

STEP | 03 SIDE RAIL INSTALL

3.1 Install Side Rails: Place the **Side Rails** onto the **Landing Pads** and loosely secure them with **1/4"-20 Carriage Bolts, Flat Washers and Nylock Locknuts** (FIG 8+9).

3.2 Secure Rails With Connecting Plates: Utilize **Rail Connecting Plates** to connect the front and rear rails together using **1/4"-20 Flanged Head Screws, Flat Washers and Nylock Locknuts** (FIG 10+11).

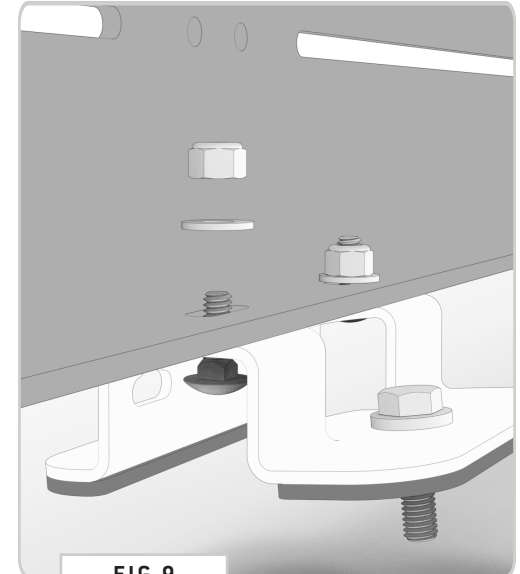

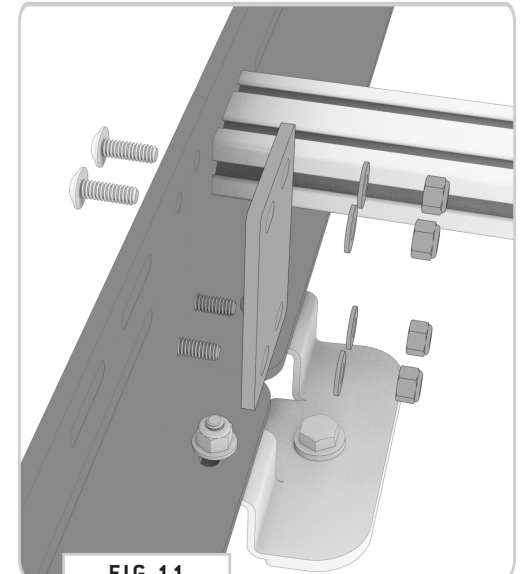

TOOLS REQUIRED FOR THIS STEP: + 3/16" ALLEN WRENCH

CROSSBAR INSTALL

4.1 Layout Crossbar Locations: Position the crossbars in your desired locations, loosely threading in the **1/4-20 Flange Head Screws** to hold in place (FIG 12+13).

NOTE - Leave one crossbar aside for mounting the fairing in the next step.

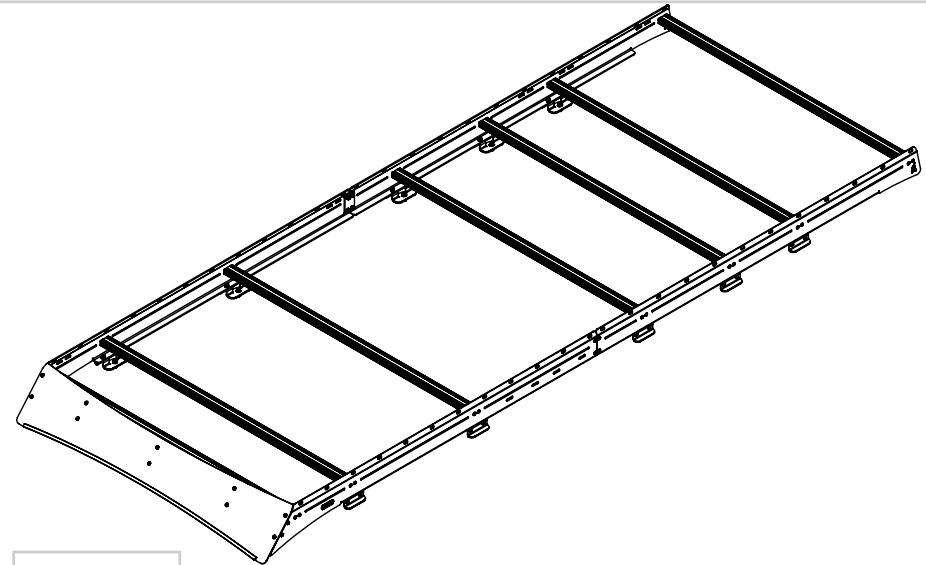

TOOLS REQUIRED FOR THIS STEP: + 5/32" ALLEN WRENCH

STEP | 05 FAIRING ASSEMBLY

5.1 Fairing Assembly: Loosely assemble the fairing brackets with (2ea) 1/4-20" Button Head Screws, Lock Washers and T-Nuts as shown in FIG 14. Slide the assemblies into the cross-bar (FIG 15) along the locations shown in FIG 16.

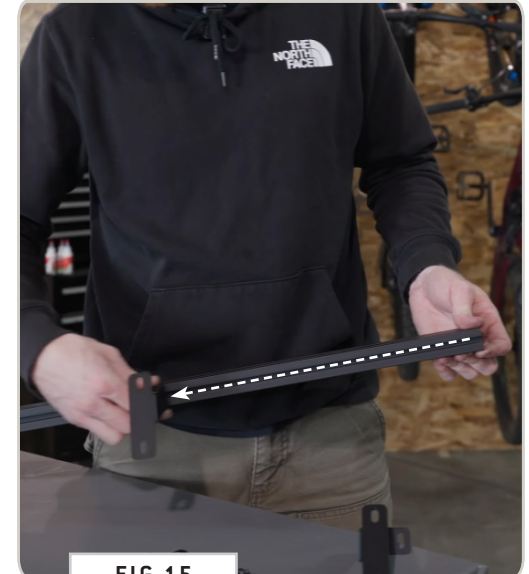

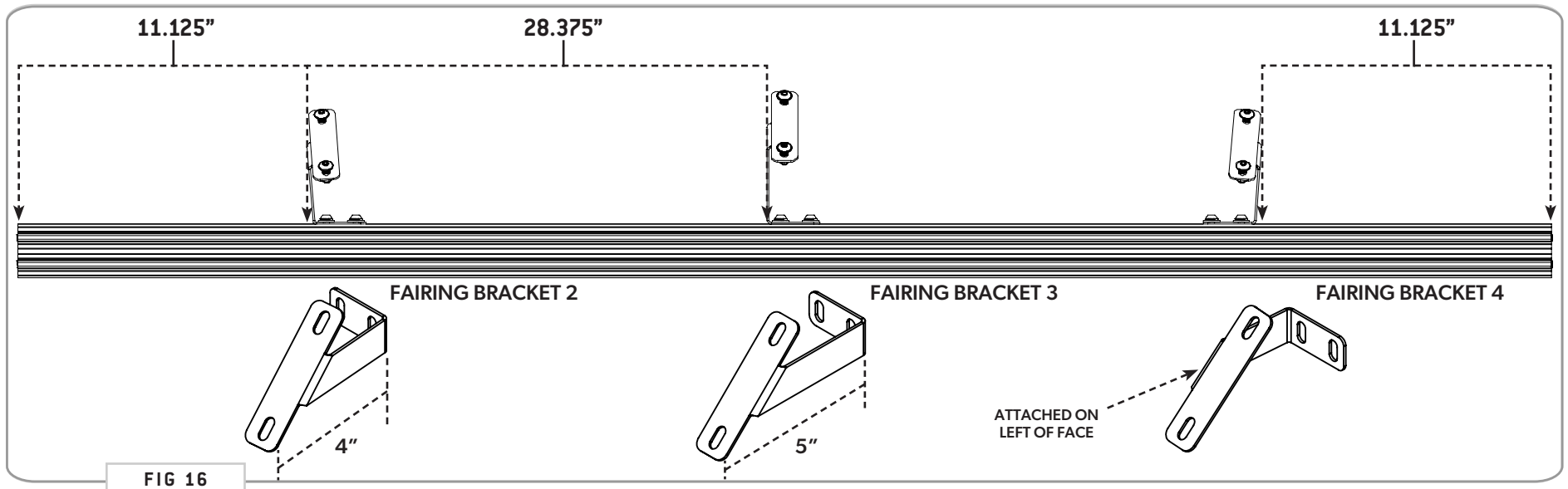

TOOLS REQUIRED FOR THIS STEP: + 5/32" ALLEN WRENCH
+ 7/16" WRENCH OR SOCKET

STEP | 05 FAIRING ASSEMBLY

5.2 Secure Fairing Brackets to Crossbar: Align holes in face of **Fairing** to those of the **Fairing Brackets** to confirm correct fitment and secure to **Crossbar** by tightening down the 1/4"-20" **Button Head Screws** (FIG 17).

5.3 Attach Fairing: Loosely attach the **Fairing** to the **Fairing Brackets** using 1/4"-20 **Flanged Head Screws**, **Flat Washers** and **Nylock Locknuts** (FIG 18).

5.4 Attach Fairing Brackets 1 and 5: Loosely attach **Fairing Brackets 1 and 5** to the **Fairing Assembly** using 1/4"-20 **Flanged Head Screws**, **Flat Washers** and **Nylock Locknuts**. Note that the flanged face of these Fairing Brackets will face outward as shown in FIG 19.

5.5 Attach Trim Gasket: Complete the assembly by attaching the **Trim Gasket** (FIG 20). Make sure that the "bulbed" side of the trim is facing the Crossbar, as that will be the part that sits against the van.

PRO-TIP: Gently tap the **Trim Gasket** using a mallet to seat it down tight against the **Fairing**.

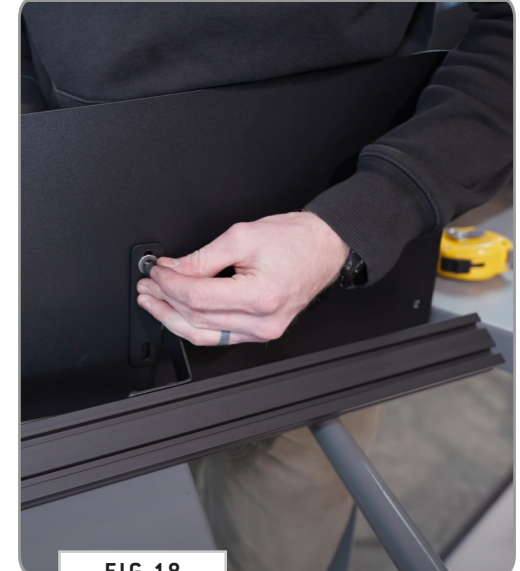

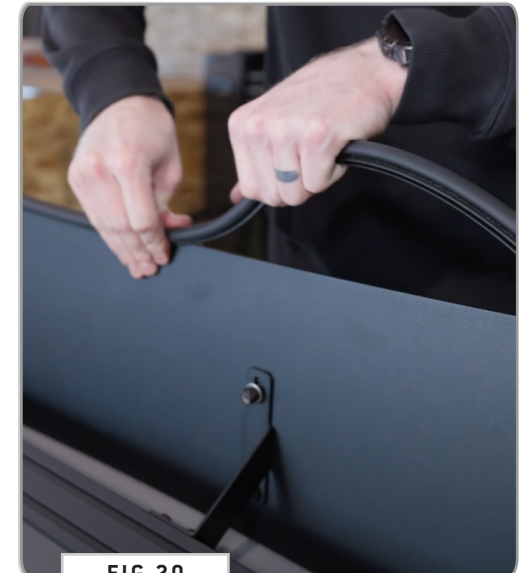

TOOLS REQUIRED FOR THIS STEP: + 5/32" ALLEN WRENCH
+ 7/16" WRENCH OR SOCKET

STEP | 06 FAIRING INSTALL

6.1 Install Fairing: With help, lift the **Fairing Assembly** up to the front of your **Roof Rack** and gently lay it down on a soft surface (**FIG 21**).

6.2 Tighten Fairing to Brackets: There is a bit of adjustment built in to the **Fairing Brackets** so that you maintain a tight seal against the van body during install. Proceed to tighten down the fasteners holding the **Fairing** to the **Fairing Brackets** once you've determined an appropriate fit (**FIG 22**).

6.3 Tighten Fairing to Side Rails: Tighten down the fasteners holding the **Fairing Assembly** to the **Side Rails** (**FIG 23**).

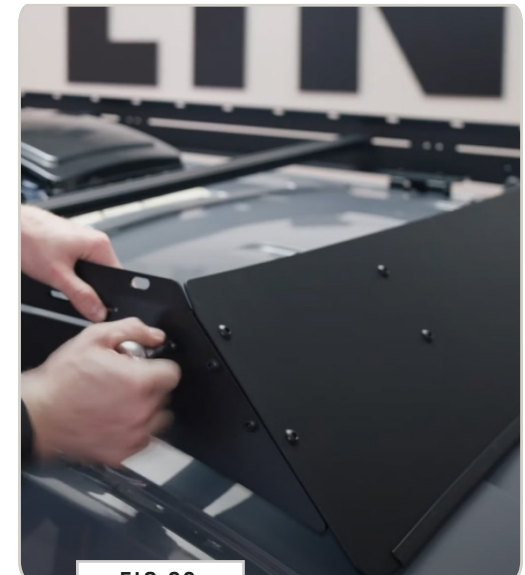

STEP | 07 ADJUSTMENTS AND TUNING

7.1 Secure Crossbars: Begin tightening the **Crossbars** into place, starting with the front-most crossbar.

7.2 Left-To-Right Adjustment: Check to make sure you are happy with your alignment to the van Left-To-Right (**FIG 24**). If you are running an awning, or have other accessories to account for, you can adjust the placement of the rack at this time.

7.3 Front-To-Back Adjustment: Check to make sure you are happy with your alignment to the van Front-To-Back. Once you are happy with how the rack is aligned, proceed to tighten down fasteners holding the **Side Rails** to the **Landing Pads** (**FIG 25**).

TOOLS REQUIRED FOR THIS STEP: + CHISEL
+ DIE GRINDER OR METAL FILE

STEP | 01 LAYOUT AND INSTALL PREP

1.1 Remove Mounting Hole Caps: Use a heat gun on a low temperature setting to loosen up the adhesive that holds the mounting hole caps to the top of the van. There should be six total. Use a chisel or plastic pry tool to gently remove them from the mounting surface (FIG 1).

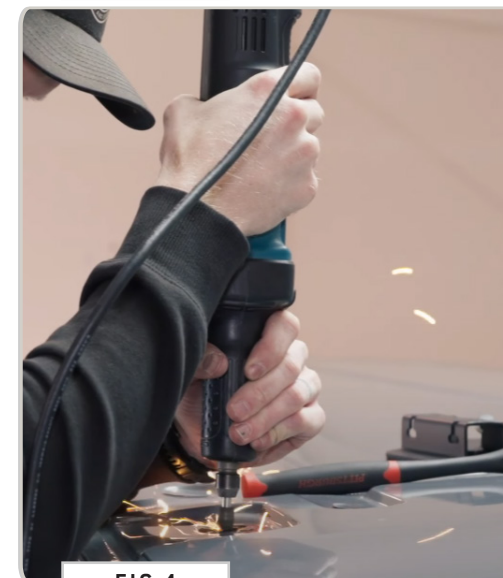

TOOLS REQUIRED FOR THIS STEP: + 13MM BOX WRENCH OR SOCKET
+ CAULKING GUN

STEP | 02 LANDING PAD INSTALL

2.1 Install Landing Pads: Secure the landing pads to the roof by tightening down **M8 Bolts with loctite and 5/16" Bonded Sealing Washers (FIG 5+6)**.

2.2 Apply Sealant: Apply a small bead of exterior waterproof sealant around the outside of each landing pad (**FIG 7**).

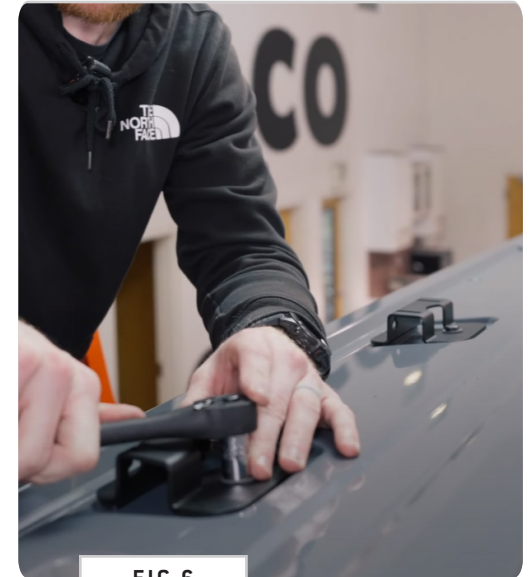

TOOLS REQUIRED FOR THIS STEP:

- + 7/16" WRENCH OR SOCKET
- + 3/16" ALLEN WRENCH

STEP | 03 SIDE RAIL INSTALL

3.1 Install Side Rails: Place the **Side Rails** onto the **Landing Pads** and loosely secure them with **1/4"-20 Carriage Bolts, Flat Washers and Nylock Locknuts** (FIG 8+9).

3.2 Secure Rails With Connecting Plates: Utilize **Rail Connecting Plates** to connect the front and rear rails together using **1/4"-20 Flanged Head Screws, Flat Washers and Nylock Locknuts** (FIG 10+11).

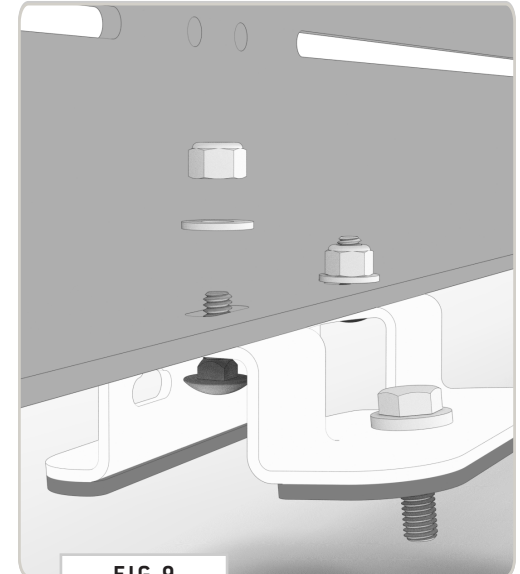

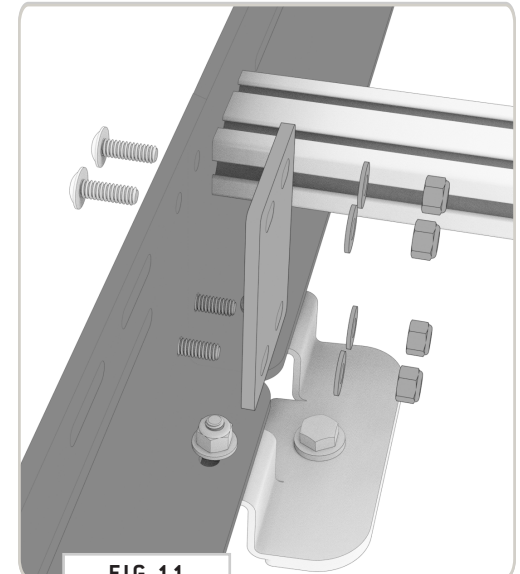

TOOLS REQUIRED FOR THIS STEP: + 3/16" ALLEN WRENCH

STEP | 04 CROSSBAR INSTALL

4.1 Layout Crossbar Locations: Position the crossbars in your desired locations, loosely threading in the **1/4-20 Flange Head Screws** to hold in place (**FIG 12+13**).

NOTE - Leave one crossbar aside for mounting the fairing in the next step.

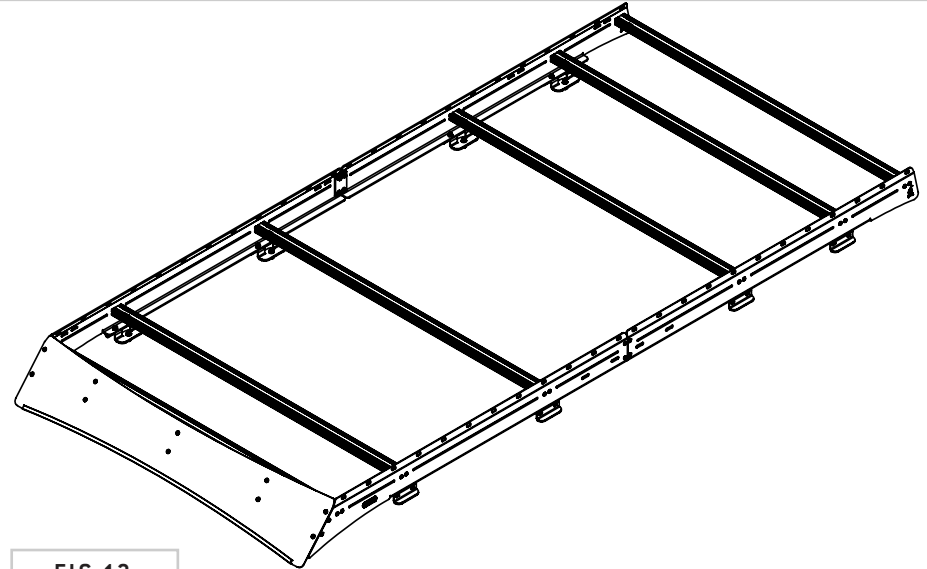

TOOLS REQUIRED FOR THIS STEP: + 5/32" ALLEN WRENCH

STEP | 05 FAIRING ASSEMBLY

5.1 Crossbar Fairing Bracket: Stack a **1/4-20" x 0.5 Button Head Screw** and **1/4" Belleville Lock Washer** as shown in **FIG 14** and insert into the six available front holes of the **Fairing Light Bar Tray**. Loosely assemble using a **T-Nut**. You'll only want to screw the **T-Nuts** on a little in order to provide clearance for the next step.

5.2 Crossbar Install: Now, slide the **Crossbar** onto the **Crossbar Fairing Bracket**. You'll have to straighten each **T-Nut** as you go to get it to feed into the crossbar correctly (**FIG 15+16**).

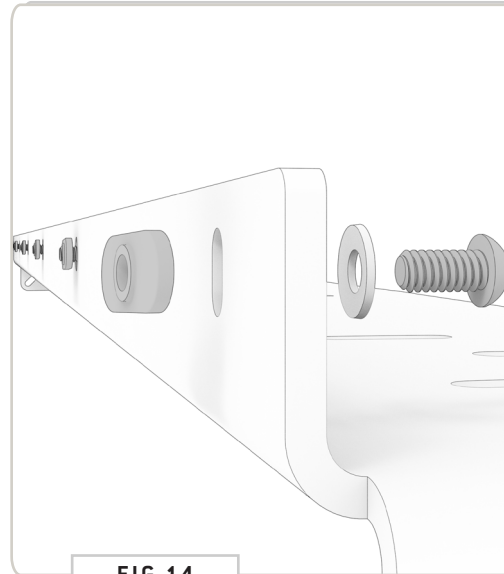

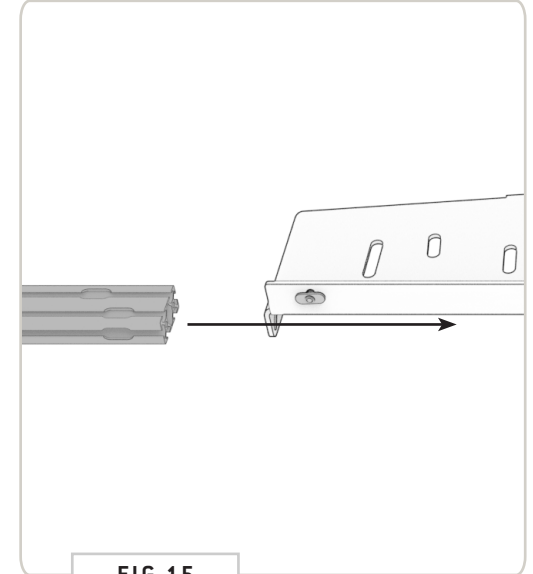

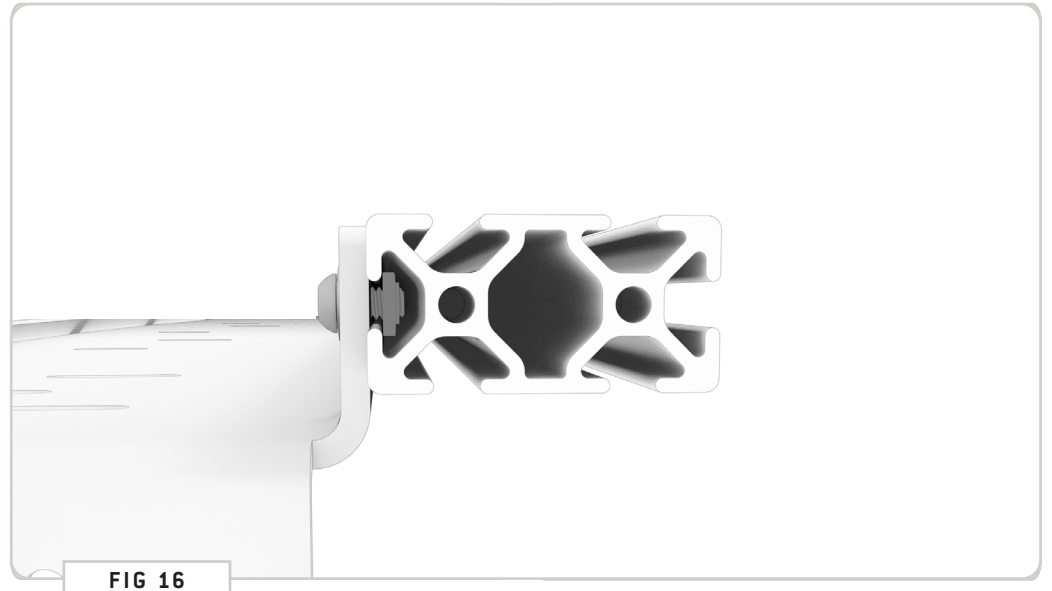

STEP | 05 FAIRING ASSEMBLY

5.3 Attach Front Fairing: Attach the Front Fairing to the Assembly using 1/4-20 x 0.75 Flanged Button Head Screws, Flat Washers and Nylon Locknuts (FIG 17+18).

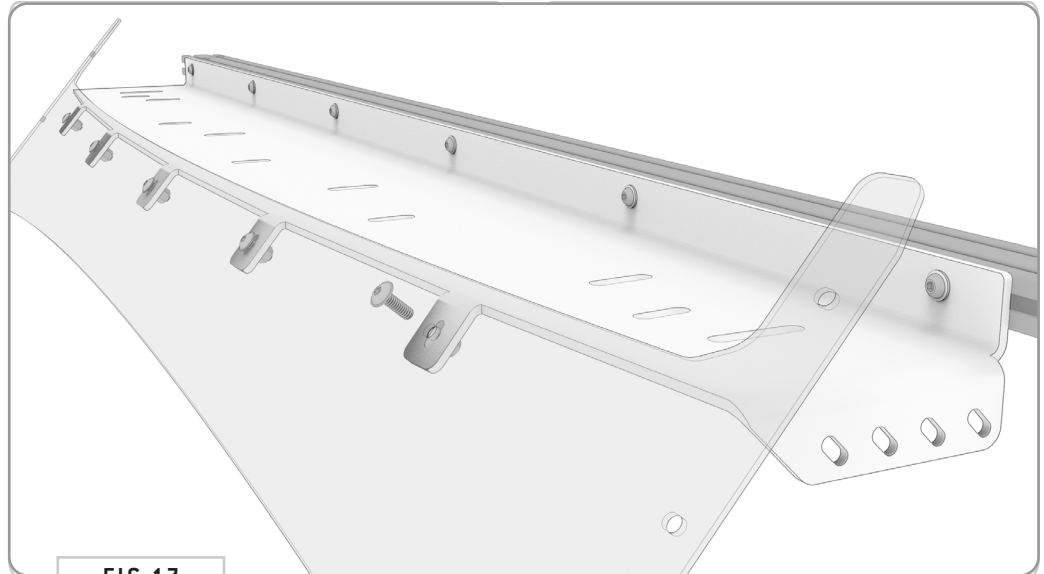

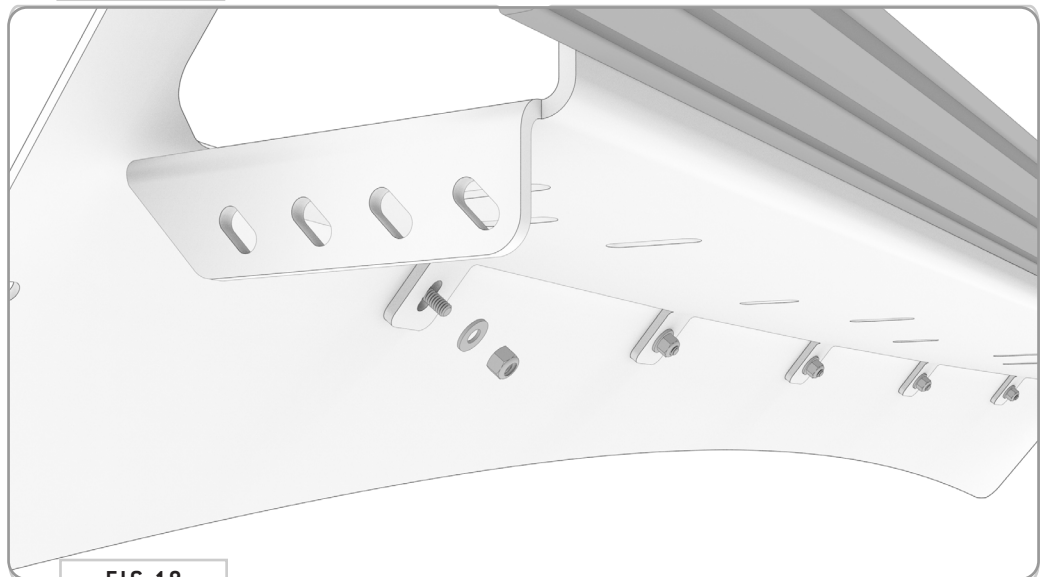

TOOLS REQUIRED FOR THIS STEP: + 5/32" ALLEN WRENCH

STEP | 05 FAIRING ASSEMBLY

5.4 Attach Fairing Side Brackets: Loosely attach **Fairing Side Brackets** to the **Fairing Assembly** using **1/4"-20 Flanged Head Screws, Flat Washers and Nylock Locknuts**. Note that the flanged face of these Fairing Brackets will face outward as shown in **FIG 19**.

5.5 Attach Trim Gasket: Complete the assembly by attaching the **Trim Gasket (FIG 20)**. Make sure that the "bulbed" side of the trim is facing the Crossbar, as that will be the part that sits against the van.

PRO-TIP: Gently tap the **Trim Gasket** using a mallet to seat it down tight against the **Fairing**.

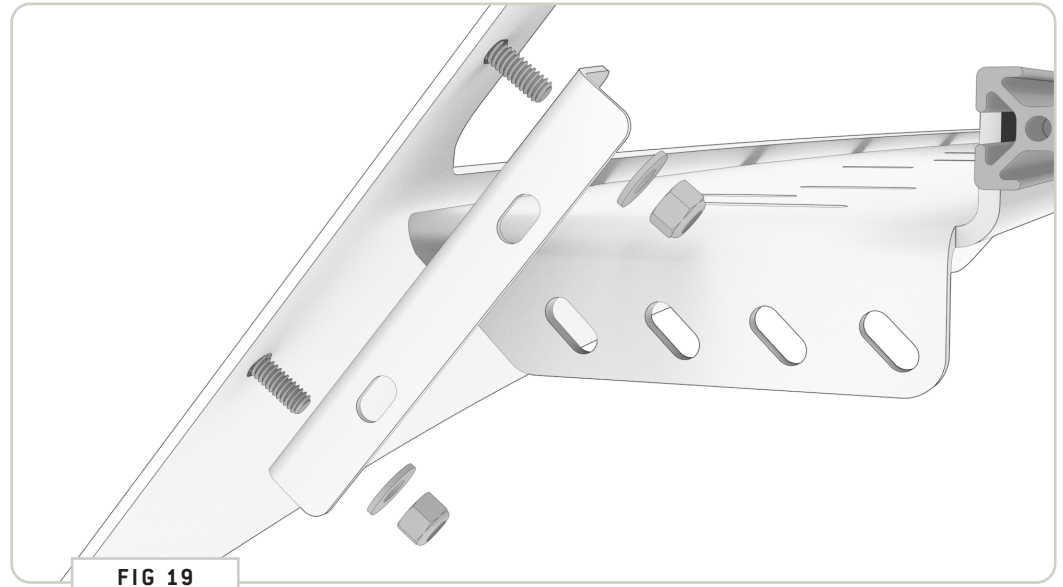

STEP | 06 FAIRING INSTALL

STEP | 07 ADJUSTMENTS AND TUNING

7.1 Secure Crossbars: Begin tightening the **Crossbars** into place, starting with the front-most crossbar.

7.2 Left-To-Right Adjustment: Check to make sure you are happy with your alignment to the van Left-To-Right (**FIG 24**). If you are running an awning, or have other accessories to account for, you can adjust the placement of the rack at this time.

7.3 Front-To-Back Adjustment: Check to make sure you are happy with your alignment to the van Front-To-Back. Once you are happy with how the rack is aligned, proceed to tighten down fasteners holding the **Side Rails** to the **Landing Pads** (**FIG 25**).

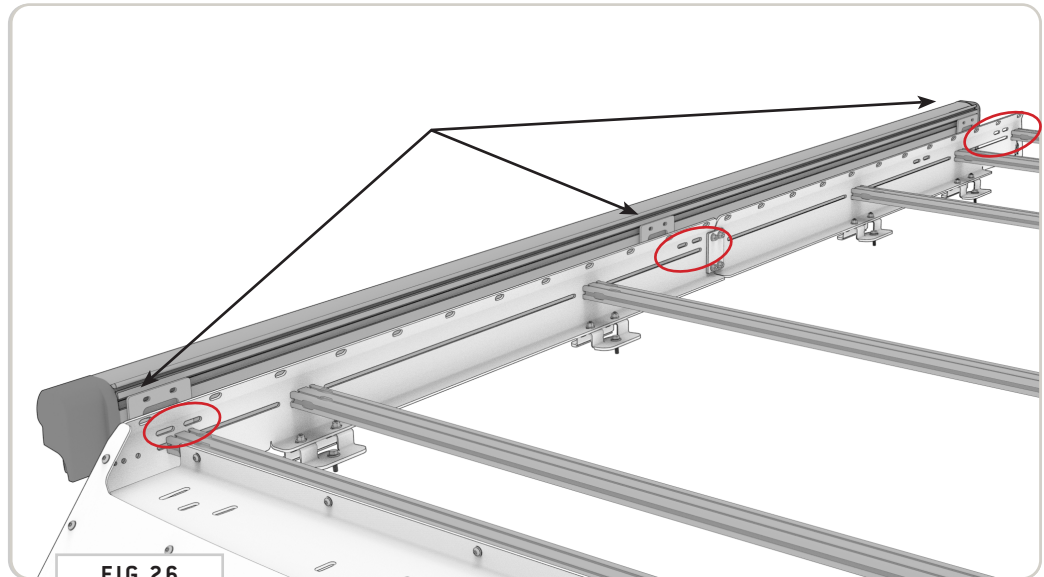


FIG 26

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

7.4 Fiamma Awning Install (Optional): If installing a **Fiamma F45s or Similar Awning**; we have conveniently placed Mounting Holes as shown in **FIG 26** for you to bolt your support brackets to. This will require the use of the included Awning Spacers.

7.5 Attach Spacer Brackets to Awning Mounting Brackets: Insert **One (1)** of the **Awning Mount Spacer Brackets** onto each **Awning Mounting Bracket**.

7.6 Attach Awning to Roof Rack: Attach the **Awning** to your **Low Pro Roof Rack** and fasten back down.

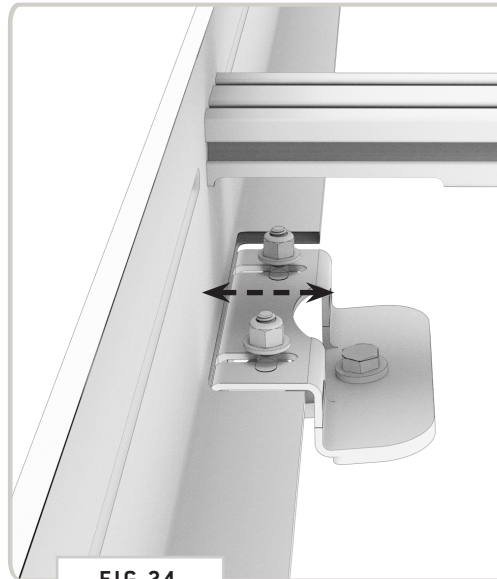
